The Brian Stewart Racing Karting Championship announces new Prize Pot offered up for second double-header weekend at Innisfil

Sutton West, ON – The Brian Stewart Racing Karting Championship heads to the historic Innisfil Indy Kartways located in Gilford, Ontario this weekend for the second double-header weekend. The event will be the first regional race run on the newly repaved track and racers can expect to see speeds up and action in every corner. The Launi family has pulled out all the stops to welcome the regions best racers as they look to master the ten-turn, 1.1 km track. The new paving will see a dramatic change in racing from seasons past according to track veteran and GP Kart team member Frank Launi.

“The paving went really well and they matched up to the curbing perfectly,” comments Launi, the 2009 Canadian National DD2 Champion. “The racing is going to be very good and some new lines are going to be tried throughout the weekend.”

Always looking to innovate and add some extra excitement to a race weekend, BSRKC organizers have added in a side prize for each class. Any driver registered in a class can throw in \$50 for a side Prize Pot. The money will be paid out 100% to the top three who paid into the pool. The pot will be split 50/30/20 amongst the top three that put up some of their cold hard cash. This is a great chance to get your fellow grid mates involved in a little extra drama. Don't be surprised to see some extra action from this new prize program.

fun to the weekend and maybe you go home with a little extra cash. Not a bad deal at all.”

The prize pot is completely on a volunteer basis and no driver is required to participate. Any of the seven classes that reach ten or more entrants will receive the normal prize package offered by the BSRKC this season. The regional racing season is well underway and with a very busy May giving way to a somewhat lighter racing schedule in June, this weekend offers racers an opportunity to test out the new surface and hone some mid-season skills.

On tap for the weekend is a full double-header racing program with official practice set for Friday, June 11th with a full schedule of warm-up, qualifying, prefinal and final set for both Saturday and Sunday. Following the opening round of two-cycle action held at Kawartha Downs, the same list of classes will be offered. All five Rotax Max classes including Micro Max, Mini Max, Junior Max, Senior Max and DD2 Max will run along with the always-exciting ICC shifter kart class. Adding some extra race opportunity to the mix, the Honda Junior Medium will again be racing for young four-cycle drivers looking to run the BSRKC regional Championship program.
