Brian Stewart Racing Karting Championship Round 3 Race Report

The month of July is a busy time for the 4 stroke racers of the Brian Stewart Racing Karting Championship. Three races of the five race series races will be run over a five week period. The racers took to the Waterloo Regional Kart Club track at Flamboro Speedway on Sunday July 11th for the third race of the 2010 season. Weeks of planning and preparation paid off with some great racing on the track, and nothing but positive comments from the racers.

For the most part all of the racing was done on dry tires with only 2 exceptions. It was the class with least amount of experience the Cadet racers, and the other end of the spectrum the Masters class that had to run on rain tires. In the Cadet race there were three different drivers who took a turn at leading the field. Ciarra Collison took the lead from pole sitter Ryley Hulme on the 2nd lap, Peter Ditner was next to take a turn at the front leading for 5 laps, but in the end Hulme managed to work his way back up into the lead on lap 8 and hung on for the victory. Ditner finished 2nd, Collison was 3rd and the top five was rounded out by Nolan Quinton in 4th and Austin Wadham in 5th.

Jake Collison entered the race weekend having won the first two races of the year and then managed to set the pace in qualifying to take the pole. In the pre-final Paul Draganac raced hard to put pressure on Collison finishing in 2nd with less than a second between them at the finish. In the final Draganac managed to finally get the lead. Collison found himself all the way down in 6th place on lap two, which set up some great racing as he set out to make his way back up through the field. When the checkered flag was waived it was Draganac in the lead, with Collison in 2nd, Robin Mclean in 3rd, John Brough 4th with the final podium spot being claimed by Brian Wilkinson.

In Junior Light it was Jaret Stewart finishing his day with a convincing win. Darren Dryden was 2nd, Clay Van Eerd was 3rd, Joshua Shantz was 4th, and Bailey Jacobs was 5th. Arriving at Flamboro with a victory in the first two races of the 2010 season Austin Bisschop was anxious to add to his points lead at this home track. That he did with a convincing win. Jordan Howse was 2nd, Gehrig Halliday was 3rd, John Ditner finished 4th and the 5th spot on the podium went to Andrew Whelan.

The two senior classes put on a great display of racing. In Senior Light it was Jonathon Treadwell who managed to make up for a lack luster qualifying run that saw him start the pre-final in 12th place. He made up nine places in the pre-final, and in the final he had claimed the lead by lap 11 and hung on for the win. The fastest lap of the race was set by 2nd place finisher Adam Racine, in 3rd was Kyle Herder, TJ Marshall and Greg Rempel finished 4th and 5th place respectively. In Senior Heavy Rempel managed to move to the top spot on the podium as he just beat David Miller to the start finish line. Miller was 2nd, Dave Patrick was 3rd, T.J. Marshall was 4th and Nelan Nadesan was 5th.

In the Junior Heavy class racer Sean McPhee has been fast in the first two races of the year but wasn't able to take the win. That would change in round three as he set the fastest lap time on his way to his first BSRKC series race win. Tristan Gill made him work for the victory as he jumped into the lead on lap three and held on until McPhee got by him on the second last lap. McPhee got the win with a scant two tenths of a second lead over Gill. Austin Penney was 3rd, Scott Nagel was 4th and Brandon Hauck finished 5th. The ICC Moto class was won by Jimmy Lo, Max Gamble was 2nd, and Giles Gallie was 3rd.

The Brian Stewart Racing Karting Championship (BSRKC) organizers, series presenting sponsors MG Tires, A to Z Capital, and Defrancesco Racing along with the Waterloo Regional Karting Club were pleased to be able to host the best 4 stroke racers in Ontario for another great racing weekend. Next up for the BSRKC is the always popular hunt for the Bear at Shannonville. This is sure to be the largest Kart race of the year in Canada. The racing action starts Friday July 30th and continues through to Sunday August 1st. The bear hunt will be second time and last time

in 2010 that the 4 stroke and 2 stroke racers will compete at the same event.
