**Brian Stewart Racing Karting Championship Returns To Innisfil Indy**  
*Ontario Regional karting series returns to the Innisfil Indy this weekend, where it will crown six of its 2010 champions*

Sutton, ON – The Brian Stewart Racing Karting Championship is in full karting mode this weekend as the series returns to the Innisfil Indy for its final event of the season for the Honda 4-cycle classes. Innisfil hosted round two of the 2-cycle classes earlier this year and this weekend will host Ontario's best Honda racers. Six class championships are on the line with many results looking to go down to the wire.

The Innisfil Indy is located just west of Gilford and features a freshly paved 1.1 km, ten-turn racetrack. With 100 bonus points being awarded to any competitor competing in all five events, no class champion is confirmed entering the event.

“We are very pleased to be heading back to Innisfil for the final round of the 4-cycle classes,” comments Lynda Chiovitti of the BSRKC. “The 2-cycle race earlier this year was very successful and I’m sure all the Honda racers will appreciate the new paving at Innisfil”

With six class championships on the line this weekend, Sr. Lite is the closest with the top five drivers all within 100 points. Jonathon Treadwell leads the way with 332 points and has one win this year. Knocking on his door is Jeremy Brutzki, the quiet racer who always seems to be around at the finish and has stood on the podium twice this year. Brutzki holds 301 points, but is only seven points ahead of third place Greg Rempel. Recently crowned Rotax Max DD2 Canadian Champion Kyle Herder currently is in the fourth position with 262 points and T.J. Marshall sits in fifth with 248.

In the Sr. Heavy class, Greg Rempel leads the way with 463 points after earning three of four possible victories. His only loss this season was the season opener at Sutton where he finished second. In second place, the only driver to beat Rempel this year in Sr. Heavy is Cory Cacciavillani. Competing in three of the four races so far this year, he has stood

on the podium in all three. Cacciavillani holds 310 points only four ahead of third place David Patrick. Right behind him T.J. Marshall has 246 points and David Miller sits all alone in fifth with 201 points.

The final Senior class in action this weekend is the Masters class. Comfortably out front is veteran Jake Collison. Just as Rempel has, Collison has won three of four and finished second in the only race he didn't win. With 455 points, he has all but secured another BSRKC Championship, just needing to start the final race. The only other winner in Masters this year, Paul Draganac sits in second place with 293 points while Robin McLean is in third with 238 points. Steve Durkac and David Conquer hold down the fourth and fifth positions with 195 and 191 points each.

In the Junior ranks, Sean McPhee looks to use the momentum he earned at the recent Canadian Championships where he finished third, to earn his first BSRKC championship in the Jr. Heavy class. McPhee has one win and two runner-up finishes this year and currently holds the top spot with 426 points. In second, last years BSRKC Jr. Heavy Champion Tristan Gill hopes a great weekend can turn him into a repeat champion. Gill sits 61 points behind McPhee and 47 ahead of third place Scott Nagel. On the outside looking in, Brett Rickeard and Grant Quinlan sit fourth and fifth with 240 and 238 points this year.

Austin Bisschop has dominated the Novice class. With three victories and a runner-up finish, he holds a commanding 168-point lead over second place. Joshua Conquer has used a string of solid finishes to sit in second place with 278 points, while 2009 BSRKC Cadet Champion Taylor Wassink is in third with 239. Right on her heels in fourth is Shannonville winner Roman DeAngelis with 232 points, and Jordan Howse holds the fifth position with 197 after missing the first two events this year.

The fourth driver to earn three victories this year is Jaret Stewart. Having an excellent breakout season in Jr. Lite, Stewart won the first three events of the year, finishing second in Shannonville. With 466 points, he is well out front and ahead of second place Clay Van Eerd who has 337 points and two podium finishes this year. Third is Ryan Mohan with 306 points, only three ahead of fourth place Darren Dryden and twenty one ahead of fifth place Matteus Makos.

Plenty of action, cash, trophies and prizes are on tap for this weekend. Saturday is the official controlled practice day, followed by a full day of Honda 4-cycle racing on Sunday.
