Brian Stewart Racing Karting Championship Finale This Weekend in Sutton *Six more BSRKC Champions will be crowned this weekend in Sutton*

Sutton, ON – The 2010 Brian Stewart Racing Karting Championship will crown its final six champions this weekend when the series heads back to 3-S Go Karts in Sutton where the season began back in May for the Honda classes. The weekend is sponsored by Canadian Insurance Brokers Inc. and Jason Jenkins. Five 2-cycle classes along with Honda Junior Medium will be on track racing for championships as well as season ending bragging rights in a Saturday and Sunday double-header. With drivers able to drop one race from the eight total races this season, no championship is officially secured entering the event.



Established in 1979, 3-S Go Karts' 1 km track is located in Sutton, Ontario, on the south shore of Lake Simcoe. As two of the Series' Principals and Organizers, Enzo and Lynda Chiovitti's facility has hosted a BSRKC race every year since it began in 2006. The racing will be contested on the track's Villeneuve configuration.

The most exciting class this season for the two-cycle weekends has been the F125 Shifter class. With three victories to his credit, Zack Meyer is comfortably out front in the point standings and enters the weekend seeking his second straight BSRKC championship. Behind him, 2008 BSRKC F125 Shifter Champion Addison Rayner holds the position and will be a threat for victory. Jamie Riberdy, Ryan Horses and Kristian Jeffrey complete the top-five in the points championship.

The Rotax Senior class has been a battle between two drivers this year as Andy Jaffray enjoys an impressive first season back in karts after a multi-year hiatus. His two victories and many podium finishes have him atop the point standings with Michael Glaze right behind him. Glaze has won three races this year, but some bad luck keeps his from the

top spot, for now. Behind them, Matthew Radaelli, Jonathon Treadwell and Joshua Mauceri round out the top-five.

This year's most dominant driver leads the way in Rotax Junior. Austin Milwain won the first five races of the season, and recently was awarded a trip to represent Canada in the Rotax Junior class at the Rotax Max Challenge Grand Finals in Italy after he finished on the podium at this year's Canadian National Championships. In second place is Shannonville winner Michael Taibi followed closely by Cameron Morrison, who has raced up front all season long seeking that elusive first victory. Luca Beltrame and Stefan Semeraro complete the top five.

The Rotax Mini-Max class has provided plenty of excitement this year with four different drivers taking victories so far. With three wins, including an Ontario Grand National victory at Shannonville, Ryan Mohan is out front with Kawartha winner Braydon Strik closely in second. Breakout driver of the season J. P. Hutchinson sits in third place, while Miles Tyson and Innisfil winner Nelson Learn are fourth and fifth.

Michael Glaze will be seeking two class championships this weekend. He will also compete in the Rotax DD2 class, and after missing the first race, has won the following five to hold a very comfortable lead heading to Sutton. Behind him, Derek Woodbridge is ahead of Zach Boam, Corey Walsh and Matthew Di Leo.

The only 4-cycle class taking part this weekend is Honda Junior Medium. Recently crowned 2010 BSRKC Junior Lite Champion Jaret Stewart seeks his second BSRKC Championship of 2010 as he leads the class going to Sutton. In second place, three-time winner Nicholas Ledson is looking to take over the top spot, while Nick's younger brother Cole holds the third position. Matteus Makos and Scotty Nagel complete the top-five.

Friday will feature an entire day of official BSRKC practice followed by Saturday and Sunday's race days. On Saturday, the top 3 winners that competed at Shannonville on Sunday, August 1 in the Mini Max class, Ryan Mohan, Miles Tyson and Gregory Hovesen, will be presented with the Bear and trophies as well as their cash prizes.

After winning the 2009 Shannonville MG Tires sponsored draw for the free trip to Brazil to compete in this year's Granja Viana 500, regrettably Austin Milwain's schedule prohibits him from competing there on November 27th. Consequently, the BSRKC Series will draw 2 Senior names on Sunday and announce the winners that will be going to this year's prestigious and world renowned special event.

Like all BSRKC races, there will be plenty of action, cash and prizes to look forward to. 12 classes are competing in this double-header. Each class with 10+ entries will receive cash prizes: 1st - \$175, 2nd - \$75, and 3rd - \$50, representing a \$3,600 purse.
