BSRKC Race 3 Results

Great racing action on a perfect summer weekend

As promised the Brian Stewart Racing Karting Championship Race 3 held at Flamboro Speedway produced some great racing action. This, coupled with perfect weather, made for a fun weekend for all of the competitors. The Series that prides itself in delivering the best value for competitors continued this tradition with cash prizes for the winners and trophies awarded to the top five in every class.

Racing started on Saturday with Ryan Mohan in Rotax Mini Max not only taking top points for the win, but also claiming the five bonus points for being the fastest qualifier. Clay Van Eerd finished second and Zachary Shearer rounded out the top three. In Rotax Junior, Jamie Lockwood set the fastest pace all day by qualifying on the pole, winning the pre final, and having the fastest lap in the final. However, the feature race winner was Chad Campbell, with Lockwood in second and Braydon Strik finishing third. Finishing out the two-stroke classes was Rotax TaG Sr/Rotax TaG Masters. Oliver Cote was the winner with Dale Cook and Jordan Lord finishing second and third respectively.

In Saturday's four-cycle action, Jeff Kingsley took the win in the Junior Medium class, followed by Nick Ledson finishing second and Scott Nagel in third. Rounding out Saturday's action was Adam Racine taking the win in Senior Medium finishing just half a second ahead of pre-feature winner Dominique Smith in second and David Miller in third.

On Sunday, it was Cadet racer Tyson Wassink leading every session. He qualified on the pole, won the pre-feature and then claimed the top podium spot in the feature. It wasn't easy in the final as Josh Bisschop was chasing him hard, finishing second in the process. Jake Watson rounded out the top three. In Junior Heavy it was Scott Nagel and Kyle Edgar racing side by side toward the finish line, but in the end Nagel kept the lead when it counted, as Edgar finished second and Brandon Hauck finished third. In the Novice class it was Andrew Whelan winning from the pole position. Hudson Turpin was second and Ciarra Collison rounded out the top three.

In Junior Lite it was Clay Van Eerd starting the final from the pole after winning the pre-final. Tyler Turnbull was never far behind in second place and kept the pressure on until lap 13 when he jumped to the lead. Van Eerd battled back on the next lap but Turnbull retook the lead on lap 17 and stayed there for the race win. Austin Bisschop finished in second and Van Eerd finished in third. In Senior Lite it was Tristan Gill taking the victory ahead of second place finisher Adam Racine and third place finisher Pearce Herder. T.J. Marshall, the Senior Heavy class leader after the first two rounds, added to his points lead by claiming the win. David Miller finished in second and Adrian Stahle finished third.

The Masters class staged a great race with the top three finishing within half a second of each other. Steve Lyons managed to edge out Paul Draganac for the win, while John Dryden wasn't far behind Draganac to finish third. The grandstands were packed for the start of the ICC/Moto class. At the checkered flag it was Mathew Di Leo with a sizeable lead over Joe De Marco in second. Josh Adams rounded out the top three results.

Next up is Race #4 and the BSRKC's Canadian National *Bear Hunt* races at Shannonville Motorsport Park. This annual action packed special event starts Wednesday, July 27 through to Sunday, July 31. Every competitor at Canada's largest annual karting event is there to vie for the most recognized, sought after, and coveted trophy in Canadian karting.
